

What Could Fresno County Do With \$550 MILLION?

Diabetes and heart disease cost Fresno County over \$1.1 billion every year.³



13.1 percent of Fresno County residents have diabetes¹ and 49 percent have prediabetes.²

7.6 percent of Fresno County residents have heart disease¹ and 34.3 percent have high blood pressure.¹

80 to 90 percent of diabetes and heart disease is preventable.^{4,5}

If we prevented even *half* of these cases, Fresno County could save \$550 million. Here's what Fresno County could do instead:



Send 67,000 children to pre-kindergarten.⁶

Create 1,900 units of affordable housing.⁷



Send 114,000 students to community college.⁸
